Please remember that Monday marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, and our school will be closed in observance. Thank you for your continued support and commitment to this important cause.

#### DATE CHANGE: Gr. 7-9 Outdoor School Camp Chief Hector

In order to allow for proper planning, we have facilitated a date change for this experience which will now be taking place <u>February 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup></u>. This is an exciting opportunity for our Grade 7 - 9 students to attend Outdoor School at Camp Chief Hector in Kananaskis. This immersive experience promises to be both educational and transformative, offering students a chance to develop crucial social and leadership skills which align with our health and physical education curriculum. During their time at Camp Chief Hector, students will engage in a variety of activities designed to foster teamwork, problem-solving, and personal growth. The program includes:

- Canoeing: Building water skills and teamwork.
- Ropes Courses: Enhancing trust and communication through physical challenges.
- Team Building Exercises: Developing collaboration and leadership abilities.
- Outdoor Skills Training: Learning practical skills in a natural setting.

The cost of this experience is approximately \$455.00 per student, which covers transportation, accommodations, three meals a day, and the expertise of campcounselors who will lead the activities. We understand that the cost may be a concern for some families. We are pleased to inform you that subsidies are available for families who qualify. Participation in this trip is optional. Due to a limited number of spots available, the trip will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis.
