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# **Principal's Report to School Council**

# **School Operational Update**

#### **Enrollment**

- Current enrollment: **722** (7 not attending).
  - Spring Staffing was based on 733 and 36 FTE.
  - We were projected at 760, but the anticipated increase in enrollment was not realized. As a result, we will be working within a very tight budget this year.
- Enrollment by Grade
  - Grade 6: 145 students | 6 homerooms | Avg. class size: 24
    - Additional teacher assigned to maintain lower class sizes
  - o Grade 7: 172 students | 6 homerooms | Avg. class size: 29.
  - o Grade 8: 188 students | 6 homerooms | Avg. class size: 31.
  - o Grade 9: 217 students | 7 homerooms | Avg. class size: 31.

### Learning Supports (Tier 3-4):

- Due to decreased enrollment and the additional resources required in specialized areas, we have had to reduce support hours in several key areas:
  - Educational Assistant: Reduced from 45 to 30 hours, with approximately 20 hours per week dedicated to targeted literacy interventions.
  - Behaviour Support: Reduced from 35 to 30 hours, continuing to focus on students with significant social-emotional and behavioural exceptionalities.
  - Student Services: We have maintained 2.0 FTE in Student Services which provides support in the following areas:
    - Oversight and leadership for our two specialized system programs (*The Class* and *Literacy & Learning*).
    - Deliver specialized tier 3 supports for students with exceptionalities.
    - Support students, teachers, and parents in addressing learning, behavioural, and social-emotional needs.

 Serve as the connect and key contact point for both community supports (e.g., external agencies and partnerships) and system supports (e.g., Area Strategists, CBE specialists, multidisciplinary teams). This ensures coordinated access to resources for families and timely intervention for students requiring additional layers of support.

### **Staffing Updates**

 Mr. Crabbe remains on leave and Ms. Kenna Williams has been assigned as his replacement until his return.

### Individual Program Plans (IPPs)

• Required for students with Alberta Education special education coding.



- IPPs are developed, implemented, monitored, and revised throughout the school year.
- CBE has committed to families that formal IPPs will be created within six weeks of the school year start, or within six weeks of receiving a diagnosis.
- Supports are implemented immediately once student needs are recognized, regardless of coding status.
- Parents are formally asked to review and sign IPPs three times per year: October 10, January 23, and June 12

- Teachers will contact families regarding behaviour, social-emotional concerns, or academic progress by email or phone.
